

LOST IN WONDER

In his book The Knowledge of the Holy, AW Tozer wrote "What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us. ... worship is pure or base as the worshiper entertains high or low thoughts of God"

I find this a deeply provocative statement – what is it that comes to mind when we think of God? How are our lives shaped by who God declares himself to be through scripture?

In Mark 4 we see the disciples caught in a storm in a boat with Jesus asleep in the stern; their response to wake their teacher was the right one. Jesus arises and speaks to the wind and waves "Peace! Be Still!" Immediately calm comes and yet this leaves the disciples with a question, "who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?".

They have been journeying with Jesus and yet they are blown away by what they are seeing - that this Jesus they know is even more powerful and amazing than they had believed up until this moment. They are being struck by the otherness of Jesus. Otherness gives us a sense that God is so pure, matchless, and unique that no one else and nothing else even comes close. How are our lives and worship shaped by the otherness of God?

Across the Summer term we will be reminding ourselves of the majesty, the power, the beauty, and the otherness of God, the God who declares "I am the Lord, and there is no other; apart from me there is no God." (Isaiah 45:5).

As we continue our journey with this Jesus, my prayer for each of us is that we would have a deeper revelation of who this God is and that it would change us forever.

ST PETER'S OADBY

We have been working with St Peter's Oadby since 2020, seeking to bring revitalisation to the church and help position them for growth and the future. There have been many positive signs including the work at The Black Dog pub. This is part of our call as a Resourcing Church and also our Network Vision.

When Jon Tearne became unwell last Summer, we felt that Jesus was calling us to recommit to St Peter's, and Sami was released to support the work there in a more hands-on way. At this time, we agreed that Sami would help lead a process of evaluating the current work and exploring new possibilities.

Sami recently shared with St Peter's (and here at SJB) about possible changes in service patterns and an opportunity to create a new contemporary service focusing on families. The St Peter's PCC is currently discerning the right way forward. However, we believe God is leading in this and we are excited by the possibilities. Launching a new service will involve us supporting them as they start children's work, with musical support and possibly some families from SJB moving to part of the new service.

Please can we encourage you to pray:

- 1. For Sami and the PCC at St Peter's as they seek to follow Gods leading with these changes.
- 2. For families to hear the call of God to move from SJB and other local churches.
- 3. For smooth transition to the new service pattern.
